#### MANY MISUNDERSTAND SUBMISSION -

- 1 Submission is not merely for Christian wives
- 2 Submission doesn't mean wives or women in general are inferior Galatians 3:28 (NAS) There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.
- 3-Submission doesn't mean wives give into the sinful demands of their husband Acts 5:29 (NAS) But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men.

## 1<sup>st</sup> All Genuine Christians maintain a pattern of <u>OBEDIENCE</u> 1 John 2:4 (NAS) The one who says,

"I have come to know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him:

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Continual <u>DISOBEDIENCE</u> to any known NT command by a believer is a serious concern
- 3rd Singles decide what is on your <u>NON NEGOTIABLE</u> list
- 4th Submission in difficult conditions demonstrates your HEART
- 5<sup>th</sup> Submission does not come naturally, only <u>SUPERNATURALLY</u>

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
