HERODIAS, first wife of Philip, then wife of Antipas

ARISTOBULUS [another son of Herod the Great] had a daughter named HERODIAS. She was given in marriage to her uncle, HEROD PHILIP, to be his wife. They had a daughter together named SALOME.

HEROD ANTIPAS'S first wife, Nabatean princess PHASAELIS, fled back to her father, KING ARETAS IV, so that HEROD ANTIPAS can steal HEROD PHILIP'S treacherous wife, HERODIAS, along with Philips daughter SALOME. Now HEROD ANTIPAS lives with HERODIAS and her daughter SALOME. JOHN THE BAPTIST continues to condemn all of this as SIN, which it is.
