# 1. Stop Judging

<sup>1</sup>Judge not,

that you be not judged,

<sup>2</sup> for you will be judged with the judgment you judge, and it will be measured to you with the measure you measure.

#### 2. Illustration

<sup>3</sup> And why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?

<sup>4</sup>Or how can you say to your brother, "Let me take the speck out of your eye," and look – the log [is] in your own eye?

<sup>5</sup>You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

## 3. Start Judging

<sup>6</sup>Do not give holy things to dogs and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them under their feet and turn to attack you.

### Review Questions

Use the following questions for discussion with your spouse and children, in a Bible-study group, or in your Community Group:

- 1. Does Matthew 7:1 mean that no one can judge at any time? If not, what does it mean?
- 2. So who can judge other people? By what standard?
- 3. In what way does Matthew 7:6 instruct us to start judging?
- 4. Be honest, what specks in other people's eyes do you tend to judge the most? Make a list and confess this before the Lord.
- 5. What personal sin must you confess in order to be able to see clearly to help others?

# Personal Application

Sometimes it is hard to know if you are judging others correctly. So before you evaluate someone else's life, ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Have I remembered the depths of my own sinfulness?
- 2. Have I confessed my sin? Have I sought forgiveness from the Lord? Have I turned from that sin and gained victory over it?
- 3. Is the thing that I am judging simply a personal preference or a clear biblical issue?
- 4. Am I guessing what that person might be thinking? Am I guessing what his/her motives might be? Or have I observed an actual sin firsthand?
