### 3rd PATIENT WHEN WRONGED

John MacArthur The godly leader who is an honorable vessel must be patient when wronged, which is perhaps the hardest qualification mentioned here. If the flesh of the old self is not firmly resisted, we are likely to become more offended when we ourselves are wronged, than when our Lord and His truth are attacked.

1 Peter 2:21–23 For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, <u>leaving you an example for you</u> to follow in His steps, 22 WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS ANY DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH; 23 and while being reviled, <u>He did not revile in return</u>; while suffering, <u>He uttered no threats</u>, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously.
