FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION . . .

- 1. Think about the trials you experience. Do you value them? Do you see God's love in them? Spend some time in prayer, asking God to help you see your circumstances from His perspective.
- 2. Are you truly satisfied with Christ alone? Think about what you consider to be your 'needs' in this lifetime. Are there any needs you are tempted to value above Christ? Be honest with God. Do you expect anything from Him in addition to Christ and His grace to forgive? Repent of anything that muddies your value of Christ alone. Turn and love Jesus afresh.
- 3. Sin is not just breaking God's laws, but it is also breaking God's heart. Is there anything in your life that you know breaks God's heart? It might be a well-known fact about you. It may be a secret sin. Whatever it is, seek God's forgiveness for this sinful attitude or desire. Turn from sin and pursue a life that emulates Christ.
- 4. Are you thankful for God's sovereign act of election? Is there any hint of bitterness toward God for His decisions? If yes, confess that smug, prideful heart, and ask God to humble you to accept His sovereign plan.
- 5. Is your claim to faith only an attempt to avoid Hell? If yes, pray that the Lord would soften your heart to recognize your total depravity and grant you a hatred of your own sin. Ask Him to produce in you a desire for internal transformation and total conformity to Christlikeness.
