Psalm 39:1 I will guard my ways that I may not sin with my tongue, I will guard my mouth as with a muzzle.

Psalm 141:3 Set a guard, O Lord, over my mouth, keep watch over the door of my lips.

Ephesians 5:4 There must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. **Ephesians 4:29** Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth.

1st - Avoid trapping your parents in their contradictions

2nd – Learn to admit your mistakes

3rd - Ask them their opinion on some issues
