
EDWARD J. YOUNG The iniquity of which we are guilty does not come back to us to meet and strike us as we might rightly expect, but rather strikes [the servant of Yahweh] in our stead...The guilt that belonged to us God caused to strike Him; He as our substitute bore the punishment that the guilt of our sin required... The shepherd has given His life for His sheep.

2 Corinthians 5:21 He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

1 Peter 2:24 And He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed.

Psalm 103:10 ... does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities.

Psalm 103:12 As far as the east is from the west, so far does He remove our transgressions from us.



Romans 3:22 ... through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

Romans 10:13 Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

2 Corinthians 6:2 Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.
