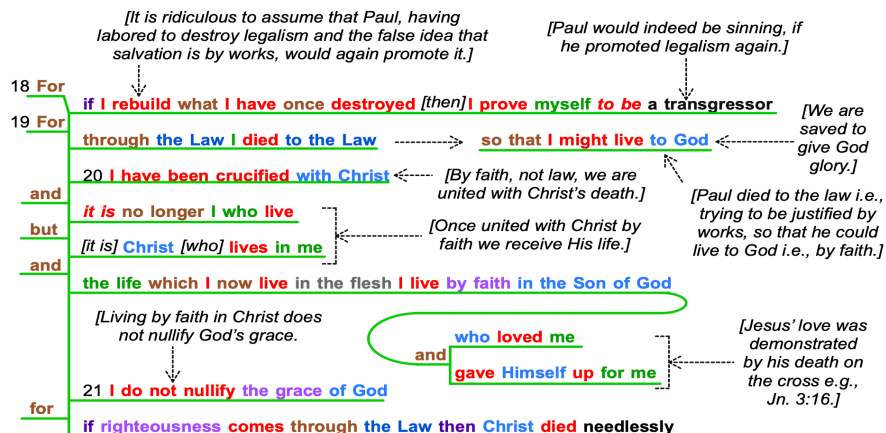
2nd Like Paul, clarify and C_____ to sound gospel truth 15-16

Mark 7:18 ...Do you not understand that whatever goes into the man from outside cannot defile him, **19** because it does not go into his heart, but into his stomach, and is eliminated?" (Thus, He declared all foods clean.)

Acts 10:13 A voice came to him, "Get up, Peter, kill and eat!" **15**..., "What God has cleansed, no longer consider unholy."
