- * Start with your story ... how you were raised to view friendship
- ★ Evaluate your key friendships based on the criteria we talked about today. A bold move is to think, pray, and sit with one of those friends for an honest discussion.
- ★ Personally ... address the issue of TIME!
 - Am I continually thankful for this season?
 - Do I enjoy my husband? My children? What is the evidence ... in my heart / that they can see?
 - What would my husband say about my friendships?
 - Outside of my home, what/who should I be investing in? Have you talked to your husband? Or that friend we've been discussing this morning?
 - Who is in this season with me? What can I learn from them? What value do I add?
 - Do I use the word 'busy' ALL THE TIME!
 - Is my home characterized by 'hurry' sickness? What does this look like?
 - Do I have 'white space' on my calendar? Do I use it wisely?
